

## MAJ Chris Telley

Major Chris Telley is an Army Information Operations officer and assigned to the Naval Postgraduate School where he is studying Information Strategy and Political Warfare, as well as defense innovation. He enlisted as a Stinger gunner, serving in Iraq 2004-2005. After commissioning, Chris spent two years as an insurgent platoon leader at the National Training Center. MAJ Telley commanded a reconnaissance troop in Afghanistan 2012-2013. Next, Chris worked on advanced technology integration with the Air Force at Nellis AFB and around the Pacific. After the Information Operations Qualification Course, MAJ Telley managed strategic communication for US Army Japan where he led the unit's cyber campaign, conducted trilateral negotiations between Japan and South Korea, and coordinated Army level talks in the region.
