In my PhD I developed an abstract conceptual framework for thinking about grand strategy. In my thesis a two-part diagnostic process was developed that incorporated selected IR theories into a structured, logical and useful policy analysis framework able to assist policy makers formulating grand strategies. The case study analysis demonstrated that the process is applicable to real-world examples; reveals the scope of the three grand strategy types, their dynamics and outcomes; and has utility for greater and lesser powers, and non-state actors.
