Warden is a researcher in the Strategy, Forces and Resources Division (SFRD) at the Institute for Defense Analyses (IDA), where he contributes to studies and analysis in support of the Office of the Secretary of Defense, the Joint Staff, the Combatant Commands, and other national security agencies. Mr. Warden focuses on U.S. defense and foreign policy, defense strategy, deterrence and nuclear weapons, and related issues.
