Moisés Naím Biography

Dr. Moisés Naím is an internationally-syndicated columnist and best-selling author of influential books, including The End of Power and Illicit. He was editor of Foreign Policy for fourteen years. Dr. Naím's columns and media commentary have a worldwide audience. His columns are carried by all leading newspapers in Latin America, and have been published in The New York Times, The Washington Post, Bloomberg Business Week, Newsweek, Time, Le Monde, El Estadão and Berliner Zeitung. Dr. Naím is a Distinguished Fellow at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace in Washington, DC. He is the founder and Chairman of the Board of the Group of Fifty (G50), which brings together top-flight progressive Latin American business leaders, and is a member of the board of directors of several global companies.

In the early 1990s, Dr. Naím served as Venezuela's Minister of Trade and Industry, as director of Venezuela's Central Bank, and as executive director of the World Bank. He was previously professor of business and economics and dean of IESA, Venezuela's leading business school. Dr. Naím holds MSc and PhD degrees from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.
